### THE CITY THAT NEVER SLEEPS!


- New York is famous for its buzzing nightlife, hence the nickname: "the city that never sleeps"

# LARGEST EF SCHOOL IN SIZE AND POPULATION

- During the regular Academic Year, EF New York is typically home to about 700-800 students, 93% live on campus
- During the summer and winter peaks, we can accommodate up to 1500 students on campus
- Students will enjoy a very active social life and will get to meet friends from over 40 different countries
- Our 25 acre campus has 11 buildings, including Rita Hall Student Center and the Sports Building
- Our beautiful campus has plenty of room for outdoor recreational activities, including tennis courts, a soccer field and running/biking trails at the Tarrytown Lakes
- Coming in summer 2017 outdoor volleyball court and barbecue/picnic area!



### LOCATION

- The EF New York Campus is located in Tarrytown, New York, a small, suburban town situated by the Hudson River.
- Campus is a 5-10 minute walk from local shops, restaurants, bars, cafes, the Tarrytown Music Hall and more......
- 40-60 minutes by train from Manhattan (Grand Central Station)
- About 1 hour from all major NYC airports JFK, Newark and LaGuardia
- Location is appropriate for all age ranges with special programs for Juniors (12+), regular ILS/AY students 16-24 and young professionals (25+)



### **FACILITIES**

- Newly updated residences, classrooms, and common areas
- Wi-Fi available throughout campus
- · Student lounges in each building
- Rita Hall Student Center includes front desk, Activities Center, computers for student use, a small theater, convenience store, 2 flat screen TVs and game area
- Fully equipped Sports Building on campus includes fitness studio, weight room, dance studio and half-Olympic sized pool
- · Cable and TV available in lounges
- Coming in 2017 bright new check-in area and school offices in Butler Hall

- · Programs offered include:
  - Semester, AY and AYX General and Intensive, Exam Preparation, various AD programs, Volunteership
  - Professionals AYP, UPP and ILSP
  - Junior programs in winter and summer; groups and individuals accepted



### **VOLUNTEERING**

- Students may sign up for the Volunteership Experience for assistance with resume building, interviewing, placement
- Assistance for AD and CD students
- Other volunteer opportunities are available for students who wish to be involved in community events such as Earth Day clean-ups, reading to senior citizens, toy drives, fundraisers, etc.
- Most recently, a record 46 students volunteered at the Light The Night Event to raise money for the Leukemia and Lymphoma society
- We have worked with companies such as Honda, The American Red Cross, The Elmsford Town Court, and the Tarrytown School District, as well as many other local hotels, small businesses and the Chamber of Commerce

#### **Rita Dining Hall**

- Open for breakfast (07:30-09:30), lunch (11:30-13:30) and dinner (17:30-19:30) on weekdays
- continental breakfast/brunch (10:00-13:00) and dinner (17:30-19:30) on weekends
- · All you can eat for one price
- Theme nights, International station, grill, make your own waffles, cooking classes, and more.......

#### The Teahouse

- Open for all meals on weekdays: 7:30am midnight (last food orders at 22h); closed on weekends
- Seasonal menu available, with weekly specials

- Wine and beer bar after school hours for students aged 21+

### LIVING

- With capacity for over 1500 students at peak, 93% of our students live on campus
- 6 residence halls on campus ensure that students are grouped together according to age and program
- We offer limited singles, twins, and multi rooms with 3 or 4 students per room
- Combination of communal and en-suite bathrooms (note: students do not choose bathroom style as it varies per residence hall)
- Newly renovated rooms, with new furniture, mattresses and bed linens. Over 50% of rooms have air-conditioning.
- Some residence halls are furnished with tables and chairs in rooms; others have desks and chairs
- All residence halls have kitchen and laundry facilities for student use
- Wi-Fi available throughout all buildings to every bed!


















### LEISURE TIME

- Average 60 minutes travel time to Manhattan
- Most students travel via Metro North train from Tarrytown to Grand Central Station – round-trip ticket is \$20.50 - \$27

Note: there are alternate ways to get to Manhattan that are far less expensive but may take longer

- 93% of students live on campus students are allocated in residence halls according to age and program
- Limited host family placements are available up to 1 hour travel time
- Curfew for students under the age of 18 is:
  - 10pm every day for JUNIOR students (age12-15)
  - 11pm Sunday-Thursday;12am Friday and Saturday for language students under the age of 18
- Lunch supplement available in Rita Dining Hall for \$35/week; typical cost for lunch in the Teahouse or in Tarrytown = \$8-\$15.





### COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS

EF New York is in Manhattan

No! We are located in a suburb of New York City, less than an hour away from mid-town Manhattan.

There are too many young people on campus and it is not suitable for an older student

No! We have a large population of students 25 or older on the professionals program. Our 25+ population is usually close to 20% during the academic year!

- It is too expensive to get to Manhattan

  No! There are alternate ways to get to Manhattan by bus

  and subway that are less expensive but take longer.
- There is nothing to do in Tarrytown it's so boring!
   Really?!? Tarrytown is a small town, but has much to
   offer! We also offer a comprehensive activity program
   on- and off-campus, as well as student clubs
- Students enrolled in the AD programs will earn a diploma with transfer credit to a an American College or University No! The Advanced Diploma programs are intensive general English programs with regular GE classes and 4 sections per week of specific content SPINs dedicated to their study area
- Students can choose to have classes in the morning only, leaving the afternoons free to explore (we especially hear this from individual Junior and LSP students)

No! This is a big school and we run classes all day, with zig-zag schedules Everyone has SOME morning classes and SOME afternoon classes, which is fair to everyone!
